High Performance News Selection for HP

BA now has a process for selection into the High-Performance teams competing at international competitions. Nomination criteria have been developed which sets the process and selection to the representative team at events and is advertised on Facebook.

Athletes who feel they meet required determinants such as a vigorous training program are asked to fill out the nomination form and provide supporting documents. From there the Selection Panel, a small group of people from outside of the HP team, make the selection based on information received.

This process will provide transparency for all aspiring athletes and open nomination up to the wider boccia community
