## Performance Pathway Update

Boccia Australia's first National Camp was held at the Australian Institute of Sport in Canberra in September. Eight of our emerging and developing athletes along with our podium athletes Dan Michel, Ash Maddern and Jamieson Leeson, along with Jamieson's new ramp operator Jasmine Haydon. (Welcome Jasmine to the Boccia family). We had a mixture of updates from the team at the AIS, learning about categorisation and on court time so that our pathway athletes have the information and education about what it takes to go from **PLAYER TO ATHLETE**. And start to build our Australian Team culture as we aim for a maximum number of eligible athletes competing on the world stage at the Brisbane 2032 Paralympic Games.



In a major milestone for Australian sport, the country's peak Olympic, Paralympic and Commonwealth Games sporting organisations have joined forces to launch a national strategy aimed at building success towards Brisbane 2032 and beyond. Bringing their vision of success immediately to life, sporting leaders took a pledge to 'Win Well' – a foundation of the strategy and a new national commitment to balancing ambitious sporting goals with cultures that are safe, fair and supportive. # High Performance

## **Boccia World Cup – Fortaleza BRAZIL, September 2023**

Fortaleza was a return to World Cup level for JP having last competed at a World Cup event in 2017. He showed steady form with a match win in the pools and a close match against top 10 player from Brazil's, Eliseu Dos Santos 6-5. Spencer Cotie/Tom Lunn – placed 11<sup>th</sup>  
JP La Fontaine – placed 12<sup>th</sup>

After 37 hours of travel the BC3 athletes landed in the seaside town of Povoá to contest the final World Cup event for 2023. It was an incredibly tough field for both the BC3's with all but one of the top ten athletes contesting the female competition and seven out of the top ten for the male competition. Both Dan and Jamieson progressed out of their pools but could not find the form to progress from the quarter finals.

## **Boccia World Cup – Povoá, PORTUGAL, October 2023**

BC3 Pairs – finished 5<sup>th</sup>

The BC3 Pairs extended their undefeated run to 21 matches until meeting an almost flawless performance from Brazil in the final pool match sending the reigning world champions into a knockout match against South Korea. Always a challenge against Howon Jeong and Sunhee Kang with Dan and Jam not able to get the better of them bringing their competition to an end.

What's next for our HP team? The **2023 BisFed Asia and Oceania Regional Championships** will be held on Hong Kong from 3-12 December. ## Classification

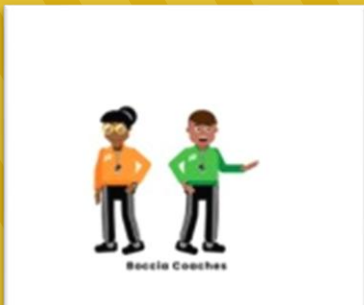

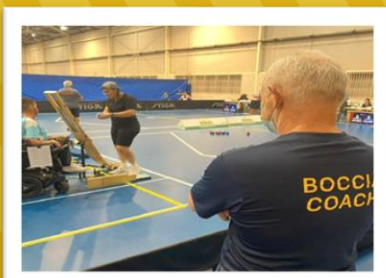
## Community of Support (Boccia Coaches)

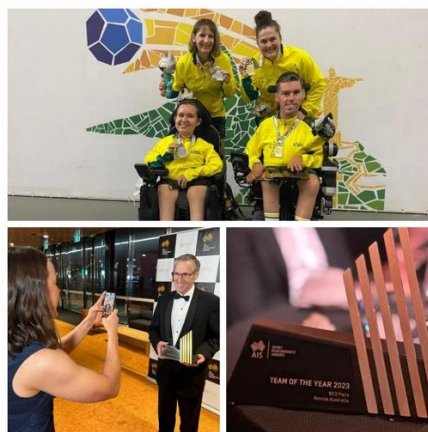

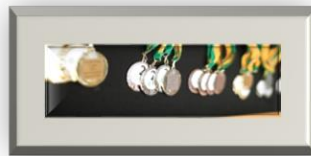
