Into just it's second year, the National Ranking System is gaining momentum with athletes traveling across the country and to New Zealand to win the 2015/16 National Champion Trophy which was won by ACT BC1 athlete Tyler Ellis last season.

In the popular BC3 category, young gun Riley Saban leads the way. Traveling 6 hours to Sydney to compete in the Junior Nationals, also traveling to Tasmania and Queensland in each of their state titles, Riley narrowly heads the competition over last year's BC3 winner Spencer Cotie.

With the SA and NSW state titles taking place over the next two months and the Boccia Australia National Titles at the end of April, all classifications are up for grabs.



This year will see the introduction of the Boccia Australia coaching committee.

Each state delegate has been invited to nominate a state coach or representative for the committee meetings.

There will be three initial teleconferences leading up to this years' Boccia Australia National Titles hosted by Australia's head coach Peter King.

It's a great opportunity for state coaches to connect with Australia's leading coach to better understand how to support their athletes through the use of the best coaching practices for continued development of our sport.

Over the past 12 months a pilot boccia coaching course has been trialled in SA, WA, NSW and QLD with over 30 people completing the course.

Feedback is being incorporated and the course will be submitted to the Australian Sports Commission for formal recognition through their NCAS process.

It's the last opportunity for athletes across the globe to qualify and compete at this years' Rio Paralympic games with the 2016 World Individual Championships taking place in Beijing, China from 19-26 March.

Australia's BC3 athlete Dan Michel has qualified for his second world championships and will be well prepared competing in Beijing only 2 years ago. Michel's meticulous preparation will see him go into the championships with plenty of confidence.

BC4 athlete Jean-Paul LaFontaine (JP) moved from Brisbane to Sydney last year to prioritise his boccia training. His focus has paid off and he has qualified for his first World Championships. JP is excited to have a crack at the world's best.





Drugs It's Your Responsibility as an Athlete

It's important to remember that ultimate responsibility for complying with the Boccia Australia Anti-Doping Policy falls on the athlete and we would like to ensure that all National level athletes (section 4.4 of the BA ADP) who need to use a prohibited substance or prohibited method for therapeutic reasons are aware that they need to apply to Australian Sports Drug Medical Advisory Committee (ASDMAC) for a Therapeutic Use Exemption (TUE) at least 30 days before the Athlete's next Competition by completing the form at www.asdmac.gov.au with assistance from their doctor.
